01) Struck Object: A single vehicle in collision with a fixed or movable object on the road surface. ie. rocks, animals, pedestrians, powerlines or overpass structure. This configuration can also be used for non-collision events such as fires/explosions and rollovers where the vehicle did not leave the road surface.

02) Off Road Left: A single vehicle leaving the road surface and running off the road to the left side. Would include rollover and/or striking a fixed object off the road surface.

03) Right Angle: Two or more vehicles involved in a right angle collision.

04) Passing-Left turn: Vehicles travelling in the same direction. One vehicle making a left turn and one vehicle travelling straight through.

05) Left Turn-Across Path: One vehicle making a left turn across the path of another vehicle travelling straight through in an opposite direction.

06) Sideswipe-Opposite Direction: Two or more vehicles travelling in opposite directions involved in a sideswipe collision.

07) Other: Please describe an event which is not listed.

08) Rear End: Two or more vehicles involved in a rear end collision.

09) Off Road Right: A single vehicle leaving the road surface and running off the road to the right side. This would include rollovers and/or striking a fixed object off the road surface.

10) Head On: Two vehicles travelling in opposite directions colliding head on.

11) Passing-Right Turn: Vehicles travelling in the same direction. One vehicle making a right turn and one vehicle travelling straight through.

12) Sideswipe-Same Direction: Two or more vehicles travelling in the same direction involved in a sideswipe collision.

13) Backing: One vehicle backed into another vehicle.

PARKED VEHICLES: If the involved vehicle is parked, it is not necessary to complete the driver details.

PHANTOM VEHICLES are ones which contributed to causing a collision but were not involved in the actual crash. These vehicles are not counted in number of vehicles, and driver/vehicle specifics should not be completed.

OPERATOR
 Proper class indicates if the proper class of licence is held for the vehicle being operated.
 Example: a motorcyclist has a class 6 licence, etc.

DANGEROUS GOODS - The most dangerous good carried is normally placarded. Placards should be located on the rear, front and left side of the vehicle. Information on Class and PIN (product identification number) can be found in either a) the vehicle placards, b) the driver's manifest or c) the plastic dangerous goods handout provided by Transport Canada.

OWNER - It is not necessary to repeat owner information when it is the same as driver information.
 Note: In order to track ownership and insurance information for "other property" damaged in a collision (e.g. light standard, domestic animal) the "Owner" section can be completed as required.
